Why: Transportation is a basic and necessary requirement for most people that impacts their ability to

The simple issue of not being able to find or purchase a ride to their doctor's office can, ultimately, result in poor health outcomes and enormous health care costs, especially for those who are chronically ill and need regular care.

VNA Health Care patients can now book a low-cost ride from their home to their VNA Health Center appointment or program. Children aged 18 and under travel at no cost.

VNA Health Care is the largest Federally Qualified Health Center in suburban Chicago and operates 16 clinics serving over 72,000 people a year. VNA is recognized by the Health Resources and Services Administration as a Health Center Quality Leader at the Gold level and ranks in the top 10% of health centers nationwide for overall patient outcomes. Outcome measures include prenatal care, adolescent weight screening and counseling, vascular disease treatment, blood pressure control, healthy birth weights, and asthma care.
