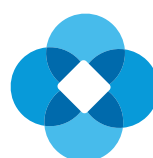

Our Mission

VNA Health Care is a humanitarian, not-for-profit organization that provides comprehensive primary care and community health services for people living in suburban Chicago and beyond. VNA strives to improve health equity and reduce health disparities with high quality, accessible, and compassionate care delivered in VNA health centers, community settings, and patient homes.



Forward Momentum >>>>

Suburban Chicago is home to hundreds of thousands of people with limited income, limited insurance, and additional barriers to getting the health care they need. For over 100 years, VNA has served everyone with a focus on serving the most vulnerable. Over the years, we have worked to expand our reach and capabilities to extend care to more people. We developed a new strategic plan - "Growing for Tomorrow" - to serve more patients, expanding from serving 75,000 unduplicated patients annually to 100,000 annually in the coming years.

As outlined in our plan, the VNA team has worked diligently to build the foundation for growth, focusing on people, technology and facilities. We continue to develop our provider, nursing and nurse/medical assistant staff by focusing on educational experiences, tuition support and job flexibility. We are elevating our use of technology with a transition to Epic for our clinical system, a new system for financial management and new technologies in the delivery of care, such as diabetic remote monitoring. We also made significant progress with our facilities plan this year.

In August, VNA signed a lease for 26,000 square feet in the former Copley Hospital in Aurora, where we will provide immediate care, family practice, internal medicine, obstetrics/gynecology, pediatrics, psychiatry, counseling, pharmacy and more, which will open during the 2024 summer. In September, we opened a new 14,000-square-foot clinic in Joliet, complete with a wellness kitchen, pharmacy, laboratory and 25 medical exam rooms. We have signed a lease for 5,000 square feet to establish a new clinic in Villa Park in 2024. In addition, we began the architectural work for a 2024 expansion at our Indian Avenue location in Aurora with more medical exam rooms, an expanded wellness kitchen and a play area for children.

A record number of patients served and exams provided by VNA doctors and nurses this past autumn, a year-over-year increase in infant deliveries and an expanded set of services are evidence of the momentum that is building. Thank you for your support as we move forward to provide more care for many thousands more people in the years to come!

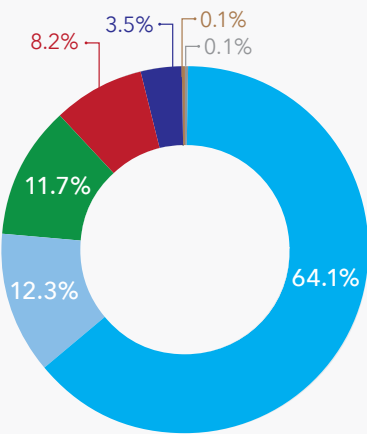

VNA Helps Severely Premature Baby Thrive

This past year, a VNA patient gave birth at 23 weeks with her baby weighing in at a little over a pound. The baby was only given a 1% probability of survival at birth. While taking breastfeeding classes at VNA, the new mom learned about the nutritional and socio-emotional benefits of breastfeeding. She was able to immediately put these lessons into good use to boost her child’s chances of surviving. Her WIC Breastfeeding Peer Counselor provided resources including a breast pump and continuous support to resolve any breastfeeding issues as soon as they arose. She was able to breastfeed for over a year and half. Due to her perseverance and the help of the VNA team, her son was able to leave the NICU after a year and is now thriving.

New Joliet Health Center

Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony



The new 14,000 square-foot VNA health center in Joliet will provide family practice, obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, mental/behavioral health, podiatry, pharmacy, chronic disease management, benefits assistance and nutrition education services.

“With this clinic, we are expanding our services in order to positively impact the lives of thousands of people in the area and the community as a whole,” said VNA President and CEO Linnea Windel.

Support for the Joliet health center was provided in part from the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) through the American Rescue Plan, Community Project Funding from HRSA that was secured by Congresswoman Lauren Underwood and Congressman Bill Foster, and State of Illinois capital construction funding secured by Illinois Representative Dagmara (Dee) Avelar and Illinois Representative Barbara Hernandez.

In the next two years, VNA expects to serve over 5,000 patients and complete 25,000 exams at this new location.

323 Weston Avenue, Aurora

Ceremonial Lease Signing

VNA recently celebrated its decision to develop a new clinic at 323 Weston Avenue in Aurora in the redeveloped former Copley Hospital building. In addition to comprehensive primary care services, this health center will also offer mental and behavioral health, an on-site pharmacy and laboratory, and a wellness kitchen. Along with same-day care available at all VNA clinics, this location will also offer immediate care for imaging, temporary casting and suturing.

Mrs. Ira Copley became a VNA Board of Directors member in 1919, just a year after VNA’s founding. It seems likely that she would have strongly approved of the decision to place a VNA clinic at this location!

Elgin Pharmacy Opening



In March, the Elgin Area Chamber of Commerce hosted a grand opening ceremony for VNA’s new drive-through pharmacy at its Elgin Health Center on Villa Street. Community leaders joined VNA staff to celebrate the new pharmacy. VNA pharmacies offer convenience, affordability and expert consultation.

New Health Services

In order to assist our patients with mobility and pain management, VNA expanded its service offerings to include Outpatient Physical Therapy and Massage Therapy.

This has been especially important to our older adult patients and those suffering from conditions that cause chronic pain.

Community Health Education: VNA works with dozens of local colleges and medical schools to provide meaningful community health experiences for students. These clinical partnerships helped students get ready for future careers or volunteer work in a community health setting such as VNA.

Rx Food: VNA has recently joined Advocate Health, Valley View School District, and the Northern Illinois Food Bank to assist with a monthly mobile Rx food pantry at Bolingbrook High School. The program provides healthier food options, recipes, and information about nutrition classes and primary care services to families in need in Will County. Since late summer of 2023, nearly 350 families have been served.



VNA’s Walk with a Doc Program: Rush Copley is partnering with VNA and providing a space for this walking program during winter months. Other months, VNA providers lead participants on walks through Wilbert Walters Park (courtesy of program co-sponsor Fox Valley Park District). During these twice monthly sessions, the group embarks on a multi-mile walk while discussing a variety of health topics in a casual environment.

Technology Enhancements



One Year Anniversary of Transition to EPIC

This year marks the one year anniversary of VNA's transition to EPIC, its new EMR system. The display of clinical data assists VNA care teams with efficient care management at both the individual patient and patient group levels.

Direct & Open Scheduling for Patients

Through the implementation of new functionality in the MyVNA patient portal, patients now have more options and convenience for scheduling appointments with VNA. Direct Scheduling allows VNA patients to make and change their own appointments online. Open Scheduling allows new and existing VNA patients to view and book appointment slots online for available providers, including providers they have not seen before. These capabilities reduce phone wait times, enable appointment setting outside of regular hours, and offer an option for those who prefer doing business online vs calling.

Addressing Food Insecurity

To address food insecurity and increase access to healthy foods, VNA worked closely with local food pantries and schools to provide access to VNA nutritionists, education on healthy eating, and food assistance via programs such as WIC.

Healthy soup was made and distributed by VNA staff and volunteers through VNA's Healthy Soup Program. And through its Recipe Portal, VNA has created a collection of nutritious recipes in English and Spanish.

Tackling Transportation Barriers

To address transportation barriers, VNA ramped up efforts to help patients get rides to and from a VNA clinic in Aurora. Rides were provided via the VNA shuttle, a collaboration among VNA, Aurora Township, the City of Aurora and Pace Suburban Bus. VNA also works with Uber Health in some communities.



860+ Rides Provided

VNA is also participating in the new C.A.R.S. program pilot, a trial program funded by the City of Aurora to provide rides to and from any healthcare appointment for income-qualifying Aurora residents over age 60 or who have a disability.

Quality & Clinical Excellence



VNA Receives USDA Breastfeeding Award

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food and Nutrition Service awarded VNA Health Care the WIC Breastfeeding Gold Award of Excellence, which recognizes excellence in breastfeeding practices and support. VNA was one of only four Illinois clinics earning the recognition this year. 11.2% of infants served at VNA locations were exclusively breastfeeding infants, compared to the statewide average of 10.1%.

Advanced Certifications

Through the new VNA Career Pathways program, VNA encourages and supports employees to advance from within and obtain advanced certifications. This year, VNA assisted two employees to become Advanced Practice Registered Nurses. VNA is proud to support these aspiring individuals and offer advanced levels of care to patients.

VNA houses two peer counselors, two International board-certified lactation consultants and three certified lactation specialists. Over 550 active breastfeeding mothers participated in the VNA program.

Diabetes Total Care

VNA serves over 6,500 patients with diabetes, many with dangerously high blood sugar levels. To help these patients learn to better manage their diabetes, VNA launched its Diabetes Total Care program.

Target Population

- Many of these patients have HbA1c levels over 9
- Many have co-morbid conditions such as hypertension
- Many have been hospitalized related to a complication of their diabetes

Intended Impact

- Improve patient short-term outcomes including reduced blood glucose levels
- Improve patient longer-term outcomes including reduced ED visits, hospitalizations and complications
- Promote patient engagement
- Promote clinician satisfaction

Program Elements

Diabetes Day Clinics offer multiple services at the same visit:

- primary care
- HbA1c monitoring
- foot exam
- vision exam
- nutrition counseling

- Remote HbA1c monitoring
- Step by Step classes
- Fresh First fruit and vegetable program



VNA Helps Diabetic Patient Lower A1c

In March, a 49 year-old male patient was seen in the ED for high blood sugar with a hemoglobin A1c level of 15 (a normal level is below 5.7). His VNA provider knew he needed help to avoid permanent damage to parts of the body such as the eyes, nerves, kidneys and blood vessels, and encouraged him to attend Diabetes Day at Bolingbrook VNA Health Center. There, he registered for Step By Step Nutrition classes and worked with a VNA diabetes educator, learning the importance of nutrition in self-management of his condition. On the last day of classes, the patient's A1c was 6.2 and he was well on his way towards diabetes remission and reducing his risk of future illness.

Taking Health Care On the Go

VNA brought health care into the community with the VNA mobile van and pop-up clinics, bringing care and health education to hundreds of individuals at schools, shelters, parks, grocery stores, and other locations.



Furthering Community Health Dialogue

At the request of Congressman Bill Foster, VNA hosted community leaders in a roundtable discussion with Democratic Whip Katherine Clark. The group discussed the Inflation Reduction Act and strategies for lowering health care costs to increase access.



Community Partners

VNA continues to expand relationships with community organizations that address the needs of underserved populations. This year, work with groups including the DuPage Health Coalition, the Aurora Housing Authority, and Hesed House expanded VNA’s ability to provide care to those who are uninsured, low income, or homeless. Through on-site clinics and free transportation to and from VNA facilities, VNA can continue to reduce barriers and serve more who are in need.

Bringing Health Care to Schools

Through the school-based health center at East Aurora High School and the school-linked health center with Romeoville High School, VNA provided care to 800 students. In addition to having access to primary health care services and mental and behavioral health services, students are able to work directly with VNA nutritionists to receive education and support with healthy eating.

A new school-linked health center, in collaboration with the West Aurora School District at the former Todd School, is planned to open in 2024.

VNA increased its collaboration with area schools and now works with 13 school districts to provide essential access to primary care services.

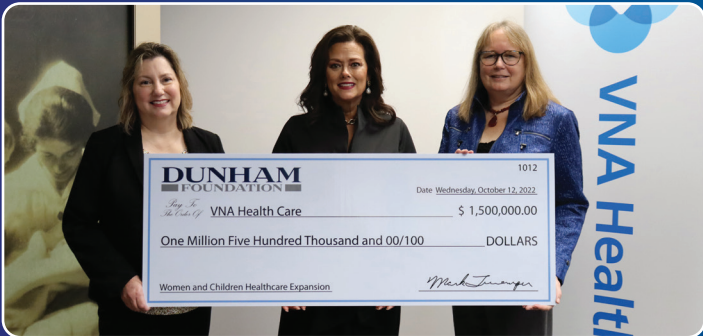

Growing for Tomorrow

The VNA Growing for Tomorrow campaign was launched in March 2023 to support capital and service expansion in preparation for providing care to over 100,000 patients annually. To date, the campaign is more than halfway there, with the ultimate goal of raising 5 million dollars over the course of 3 years. These funds will help build new facilities, enlarge/improve current facilities, and provide staffing and operational support. These expanded locations and services will improve access to care for people at increased risk of health disparities who may face increased barriers to care.

VNA will open a 26,000-square-foot health center, built on the site of the former Copley Hospital on the east side of Aurora, which will provide both primary care and immediate care services. VNA will also be launching a school-linked health center service that will be located on the site of the former Todd Elementary School, serving West Aurora School District #129. VNA's service area is also expanding with a new clinic in Villa Park in DuPage County. This clinic will expand access for the underserved populations in Villa Park and surrounding communities.

The expansion of the VNA Health Center located at 1400 Indian Avenue will begin in 2024 to provide enhanced Obstetrics & Gynecology and Pediatrics services. A new supervised play area for children will be a welcome added feature to this clinic, as it is intended to help parents who may otherwise delay their health care due to a lack of available childcare during their appointment time.

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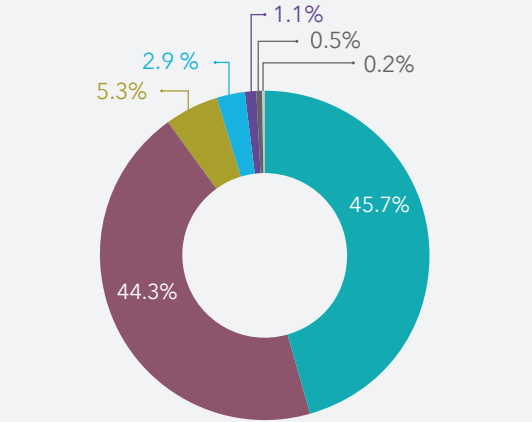

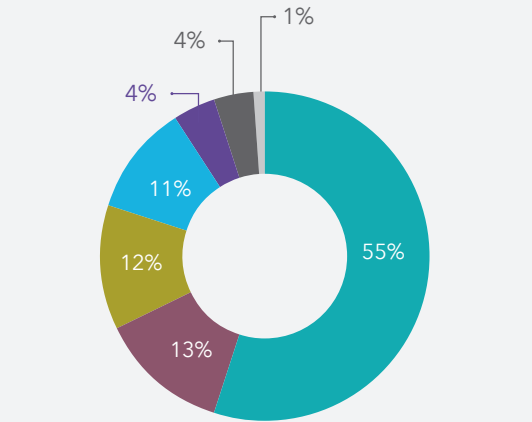

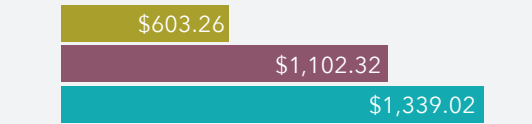
Sources of Revenue FY23

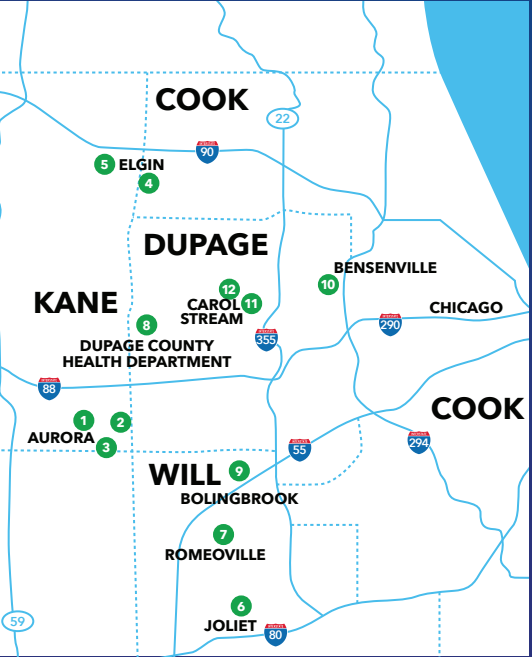
